WUXI, June 15 - As a special guest of the summit, Dobrica M. Milovanovic, Deputy Mayor of City of Kragujevac, Serbia, brings great expectation on cooperating with Chinese outsourcers at the 2013 Global Outsourcing Summit (GOS) at Wuxi.

At the round meeting held in the afternoon, Milovanovic gave a presentation on "Outsourcing in Serbia and its Potential". Representing Kragujevac city council, he is in charge of the international cooperation. He tries to improve the visibility of Serbia through getting involved in various events. "Not many people know the city and the country. But Serbia urges to attract interests from international outsourcers," told by Milovanovic. In the summit which gathers top leaders and elites from countries all over the world, he tried to build as many contacts as he can.

Although China has been engraved on Milovanovic's mind since decades of years ago when he was young, he stepped on China's land four days before 2013 GOS. He thought he learnt much about China but was still amazed when he visited the industry parks in Wuxi. "It is far away of my imagination. It's such a fast developing city," Milovanovic said. "The sightseeing of the outsourcing parks really impressed me. There are excellent modern industry parks. We dream to be connected with these companies."

Despite large potential opportunities, challenges also emerge when talking about cooperation. All the time, Milovanovic wonders how to overcome barriers between the two countries. "China is a huge country, but Serbia is small. I wish to introduce more about Serbia to interest the local outsourcers." As more and more Chinese companies has moved into European market, Milovanovic believes Serbia has competitive advantages for outsourcing on low taxes, low cost labor force, skilled workers and well-educated young people. "It would become a very good base for companies to invest. Young people prefer to stay and work in Serbia rather than to go to EU countries because of certain EU working restrictions. IT outsourcing would be great opportunities for them. With the benefit of simple facilities they could even work at home." Milovanovic said. "We are eager to connect with local outsourcers as long as they have interests."
